

Changes to School Calendar in Term 2

(i) PRIDE (Performance Recognition for Individual Distinguished Endeavours) Day for 2017 Prize Winners

PRIDE Day for 2017 prize-winners will be taking on a different format and has been rescheduled to take place during usual school hours. As such, please note that Friday, 13 April 2018 will be a normal school day for all pupils.

Prize winners will receive a separate letter from the school with more information.

(ii) E-Learning Day & Experiential Day 1 for P1 to P4 pupils

Please note that the E-Learning Day and Experiential Day 1 for P1 to P4 pupils have been rescheduled to a different time of the year, as the originally scheduled dates are near the mid-year examination.

As such, all P1 to P4 pupils will report to school for lessons as usual on 19 and 20 April 2018.

Primary 2 School Dismissal from Term 2

As our Primary 2 pupils become more independent, they will be dismissed by their teachers at the ground floor after curriculum hours. Primary 2 pupils will head to their respective dismissal gates <u>independently</u> to wait for their parents/guardian or to head home by themselves.

This will come into effect from the first day of Term 2 on Monday, 19 March 2018.

P4 to P6 Sports Day

Frontier Primary School will be organising Sports Day for all Primary 4 to 6 pupils on Friday, 9 March 2018. Pupils will be competing in relay events with basketball, scooterboard and skipping elements. There will also be an inter-class modified netball tournament.

Koobits is an online mathematics learning portal for primary school pupils. This year, Frontier has subscribed to Koobits for all pupils to access regularly at home. After login to Koobits, pupils will see a dashboard to access the different sections such as challenge, homework, Koobits brain games and more! With each question that pupils attempt, they will accumulate points and koko credits which can be used to play the KooBits Games.

5 Questions To Encourage Your Child To Ask in Class



As parents, how can you help your child be engaged in their learning in school?

We hope you and your child have been talking. But what if he tells you he doesn't know what to ask the teacher when the subject is a tough one? Here are five questions to start him off on this journey.

Teacher, can you help me understand...?

Encourage your child to clarify with the teacher dur-






Whether it's helping the teacher with small tasks such as setting up the projector or distributing worksheets, remind your child to be helpful to the people around him and contribute positively to his environment. Plus, this way, he's learning about how teamwork works. He can try taking the initiative to sweep the classroom floor when it's dirty, even when he's not scheduled to do that — or better, getting his friends to help out at this task.

Can we agree on this?

When everyone in the group has different views, what should your child do? If he is older, he can identify the problem statement, and get the group to evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of each option. Try and guide the discussions towards reaching a consensus. In this way, he learns to exercise good facilitation and problem-solving skills. For younger children, remind them to listen and respect different opinions. If the situation escalates, ask the teacher for help.
